Parking in Rottingdean and Hoggs Platt

Just a reminder to park safely and legally in Rottingdean. A massive thank you to all the parents of our school that we know who do this well. As we all know, no school is easy to park at to drop off and pick up children. Please can we all be respectful of the safety of all children and pedestrians in Rottingdean. There are parents from our school who are still parking on double yellow lines in the High Street. This is highly dangerous and illegal. It places the lives of others at risk and the school is asking that it does not happen.

Please try to leave plenty of time to park legally and safely and walk into school. Those using the allotments and who have livestock to access via Hoggs Platt are unhappy with the number of parents parking here. Please be mindful and park elsewhere to enable these people to have access to their properties and not block their right of way.

There is no easy answer to this issue and the school has continually had to deal with many parking issues since it was established almost 50 years ago. If all parents/carers parked safely and legally this would not be an issue any more. We are constantly calling the Local Authority to send out traffic wardens to give tickets to those who do not park respectfully and lawfully.

We have also been advertising, for a very long time, for a Traffic Patrol person via Brighton and Hove Council website, the school and parish newsletters as well as Rottingdean Village news. If you know of someone who is interested please ask them to contact the office.

We really do thank you for trying to keep our children (and all pedestrians and drivers) safe in our very busy village!


