Lateness

Just a gentle reminder that the school day officially starts at 8.50am. At this time, children should have taken off their coats and be sitting at their desks ready to start the school day — not arriving at school. We always strive to have the school gates and door open at 8.40am for children to go directly to their classroom and prepare for the day. There are a number of activities for the children to do. From 8.50am children are working on responding to their marking comments from their teachers. There are also intervention groups set up to help children make even further progress. We cannot stress how important it is that your child arrives in time to start the school day. They will feel composed and ready for the day, not anxious, stressed or embarrassed. Thank you for your continued help with this.

We strongly encourage you to support your children to take up a musical instrument. We are very fortunate to have Brighton and Hove Music Service teachers that visit our school to teach a number of musical instrument lessons — notably, violin, keyboard, guitar and singing. We have also had Cello players in the past. If your child is interested in learning an instrument please get in contact with the school office. Currently we have spaces in violin sessions and all instruments taught.

Money into office or to PTA in named envelope

Please ensure that monies handed into the office for the school, PTA or Governors is placed in a named envelope. This will help the office be able to track who has paid in what to whom! The office staff are always busy as well as constantly handling sums of money throughout the day. It will help them immensely if you could label money appropriately. Mobile Phones

Can we please remind all parents, carers, families and visitors to the school that we do operate a very strict mobile phone use policy. We ask that people do not use their phones at all in the school entrance foyer or anywhere in the school building — use within the school can only ever happen with prior permission or from

the school where there is a good reason.

Mobile phones have become an everyday part of life for us all — calendar, diary, personal organiser etc. In order to control the use of mobile phones, particularly their risks to safeguarding by photos being taken or recordings being made, we ask that information is inputted outside the main entrance doors under the entrance shelter. Make a mental note or jot a meeting time down on paper to input or check a date outside the building. Many thanks for enabling us to maintain a safe environment for our children to grow and learn.

GOVERNORS' PARENT SURVEY - AUTUMN 2018

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you have all settled well into the new Autumn term. It was really good to see so many of you at Parents' Evening when you dropped by "Governors' Corner" for tea and biscuits while waiting to speak with your child's class teacher. Also, those who could attend our PTA Firework 'Autumn Extravaganza'. It was an amazing event in which the whole school community were present – a real celebration of all that is great about our community school!

It is again that time of year when we want to share as well as hear from you. Much has happened:

- We are again pleased with the SATS key stage 2 results which reflect how the school team are embedding the new interventions into the school, and show pupils' individual strides in progress compared with where they stood at year 2.
- Teachers are continuing with programmes and strategies such as Read Write Inc Phonics, Project X guided reading resources and 'Talk for Writing' strategies which are having a noticeable impact on writing and literacy skills across the school. Furthermore, our physical structures continue to be dramatically renewed, with our resurfaced playgrounds, refurbished classrooms and library and soon to be officially opened wild life trail and outdoor learning area at the top of the school site.

In keeping with this continual development, we re-drafted our school Mission Statement after much discussion and activity across the school to have everyone involved. A much more effective, visual and simpler statement that directs us all, in what we do.

Parent Workshops in Phonics, Reading, Writing, Spelling and Maths are being delivered over this half term to ensure we have true partnerships working between families and the school to enable all our children to have more opportunities to make even more progress.

As part of our partnership with parents, the Governors want to hear your views on the school, on all matters, great and small. We hope to hear your thoughts on interactions, too – such as governor communication and the parent council.

Device use and screen time can often be a tense topic for parents, and the cause of many arguments. However, technology companies are providing more and more ways to help parents tackle the issue via the devices themselves. To help you and your children adopt a safe and healthy approach to using devices and the internet, we have compiled a list of useful apps and suggested ground rules....

Apps that can help: * Moment Family (iOS only) – monitors and sets device usage limits. * AppDetox (Android only) – monitors and sets individual app usage limits. * Forest (iOS & Android) – promotes concentration & productivity away from phones.

Ground rules: Apps can help to enforce device usage limits, but ground rules need to be discussed by the whole family so that everyone can agree to a fair usage plan. This could include:

- * Device curfews, such as 8pm/bedtime.
- * Phone-free meal times.
- ★ Using real alarm clocks, so children don't need devices in their rooms at night.
- Leading by example! Actively reduce your screen time when around your children, so that you can dedicate your concentration to more family time.
- Having regular family discussions about technology and appropriate phone use to show your interest, so that children are more willing to involve you in their online world.

* Stop, Speak, Support:

Cyberbullying In Anti-Bullying Week 2017, the Royal Foundation Taskforce on the Prevention of Cyberbullying, set up by the Duke of Cambridge, launched a campaign with young people called 'Stop, Speak, Support'. It included a code of conduct for young people, a series of animations and supporting resources to try and positively change children's behaviour online. The Anti-Bullying Alliance is now taking the campaign forward as part of Anti-Bullying Week. Find out more at www.stopspeaksupport.com.




* Fortnite: a correction

In the last edition, we incorrectly said Fortnite is a game for primary-aged children. We'd like to make cl that in fact the game has a rating of 12. Not-for-profit organisation Internet Matters - who are supported by the UKs most prominent internet industry players and leading child online safety experts – has released a statement regarding the rating of Fortnite: 'In the UK, the Video Standards Council rate Fornite as PEGI 12 for frequent scenes of mild violence. iTunes rates the game only suitable for children 12+ for Frequent/ Intense Cartoon or Fantasy Violence and Infrequent/ Mild Medical/Treatment Information. Parents know th children better than any rating body and can use this information to make an informed decision.' * When children fall out with friends

- a guide for parents/carers

We all know that when children fall out with their friends it can affect them very badly and spill out to the parents of the children involved. So how do you handle a falling out between friends?

Here is a 10 stage plan to help you cope...



- * 1. Ask the question, "Tell me what happened?".
- * 2. Let your child offload without reacting. Listen with your full attention and show you are genuinely interested. Keep eye contact and nod, look sad, say things like "I see" but make no judgements.
- 3. Help them to talk about and name their feelings. Say things like "You seem really, sad, angry..." (the emotion you are seeing).
- * 4. Repeat this pattern. "So what happened next"?
- ★ 5. Give examples that show it's ok to fall out and other people fall out too. For example share an experience that you had as a child and how you resolved it.
- * 6. Look for solutions. What do they want to happen? Do they want to make up? Do they need to say sorry? Tell their friend how they feel? Sometimes a cooling off period can also help.
- * 7. Try getting them to see things from the other's point of view. How do they think their friend saw the argument? What would another friend say?
- * 8. Use films, TV programmes, films or toys to help them explore the issue.
- * 9. Whenever possible let the children sort the situation out themselves and don't get involved by falling out with the friends parents which usually makes the situation worse.
- * 10. If you think the situation is bullying talk to your child's school.

Digital friends

For Safer Internet Day 2018, the UK Safer Internet Centre commissioned an online survey of 2000 young people aged 8-17 years. The findings reveal how important technology is to young people's relationships, and how they view the idea of 'friends'. It showed both the positive and negative role that technology can play in young people's relationships and the continuing importance of support from the adults in their lives to help children negotiate the internet.

The most popular platforms for 8 – 17 year olds to chat to their friends are You Tube (41% use), Whats App (32%), Snap Chat (29%) Instagram (27%) and Facebook or Messenger (26%).
