Governors' Corner

As part of our drive to become a Green Flag school the Governors are excited to share with you that they are currently looking into installing solar panels on the school roof to generate our own electricity! A very exciting project that we will keep you informed about.

Lateness

During a recent Educational Welfare Officer (EWO) audit visit to the school it was noticed that there are a high number of children arriving late at school. The school gate opens at 8.40am for the children to enter the school and start the day with some educational activities. The start of the school day is 8.50am when all children should be in school and settling down to start work and the school doors close. It is important that children are on time for school. They are composed and ready to start the school day. When a child is late they are generally stressed from the journey to arrive at school and then worry about entering a class of children that have already begun their learning. More than that, they will miss out on early interventions or class work to respond to marking. The school will be sending out letters to families of children that are consistently late for school. We have been reminded by the Local Authority and EWO that repeated lateness will entail a fixed penalty fine. Please ensure your child arrives at the correct time to avoid this.

Absences/Holiday request's

We have also been reminded by the Local Authority that if a child is absent from school for 3 or more unauthorised days the family will be issued with a fixed penalty fine by the council. Parents should refer to the Attendance and Welfare Policy of the school (on the school website) and ensure they inform the school at least 4 weeks in advance of an absence unless it is an authorised emergency. Missed education cannot be caught up on. Please see the council's Absence awareness campaign information below. Currently we are at 96.17% attendance across the school and would like to attain our target of 97% this year. Research shows that high attendance always corresponds with good progress and achievement.

Dear Parents,

Re: Art Therapy

We are fortunate in that we will be able to offer a small group of children 6 x Art Therapy half day sessions in the Spring and Autumn terms 2019. This will take place during school time in The Arches. All materials will be provided. They will be run by Caroline Pendray, our Schools' Primary Mental Health Worker and State Registered Art Therapist.

The sessions will offer children the opportunity to explore their thoughts and feelings in a safe, contained confidential environment. Art Therapy is usually aimed at children who are suffering from feelings of anxiety, or who have experienced significant trauma or loss. It is not beneficial, nor would it be allowed, for it to run alongside another therapeutic intervention, e.g. counselling or CAMHS support.

We will be choosing who will take part according to need, and are keen to offer you the opportunity to refer your child stating the reasons why they should take part and how you hope they would benefit from this. We plan for a TA to work alongside the children and for them to offer subsequent Art Nurture sessions for children who do not get a place with Caroline. These TA led sessions would not be discrete therapy, but address needs of self-confidence/self-esteem and social interaction.

If you would like your child to be considered for a place on this Intervention, and they are not already benefitting from an alternative therapeutic provision, I would be grateful if you could send me a letter explaining why you believe your child should be referred and how you feel they will benefit, via the school office before January 18th 2019. I shall then be in contact to request further consent via the appropriate forms.

As you can appreciate, this can only benefit a small group of children, so please think carefully about whether this is the best form of support for your child before replying. I regret that we will be unable to offer all children referred a place.


