

We are all beginning to get very excited about the forthcoming 50th Anniversary of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic primary school. The governors have been busy planning events that will happen on Saturday 29th June (details to follow) and school staff are working together to create a curriculum that truly celebrates the beginnings of our school in 1969. A remarkable year that was not only celebrating American astronauts landing on the moon! It is when St Martha's Convent school became Our Lady of Lourdes. The children will also look at the history of our school development as well as cultural events that have taken place over the decades since the school was established. We will then share these with you over the week commencing the 24th June in class and whole school exhibitions.

The celebrations will culminate in a Celebration mass we will be holding at the school at 1pm on Thursday 27th June led by Bishop Richard. This will be attended by all children and as many parents and carers as possibly can make it, Marie Ryan, Diocesan Director of Catholic education, former headteachers and long serving staff of the school and local community leaders. This will be followed by an afternoon tea for all in the school grounds. The Governors and PTA are also working collaboratively to stage fun events for former pupils and their families. And details will follow soon.

Year 4 Wild Beach



John Muir Award

For our final Wild Beach day, which marked the end of our John Muir Award project, Year 4 invited parents/carers to join us in the afternoon. As part of this award we had to discover, explore, conserve and share knowledge about a wild area.

In the morning, the children chose which activities they would like to share with their family. Despite the inclement, blustery weather, we attempted to erect shelters (which unfortunately could not withstand the wind!) and we were determined to fit in a last session of rock pooling. During the rock pooling, we were delighted to see a rare starfish and were fortunate enough to observe sea slugs laying eggs! We also wanted to share what we had learnt about the strand line and the clues it provides about life on the beach. In addition, some children did another litter pick to show the different types of pollution discovered on the beach.

It was a great afternoon - parents took part in litter picking, stone tapping, chalk painting, rock-pool creature observation, strand line museum information sessions, rock creature creation and had a good look through the children's Wild beach folders. At the end of the day, children were awarded their John Muir certificates. Thank you so much Katie (Sussex Wildlife Trust) for all the knowledge you have shared with us. We had a wonderful time!

Children's Parade





School Uniform

Traditionally the children at Our Lady of Lourdes School have worn school uniform. This is supported by the whole school community. We are very proud of the standard of uniform in the school and hope that the parents will continue to insist that their children wear the correct items. **Please ensure all items are clearly labelled/named.** The code for uniform is as follows:



Main uniform (girls and boys)

GREY trousers or GREY knee length shorts (girls and boys) or GREY skirt or pinafore dress (girls).

Plain WHITE shirt or polo shirt (girls and boys). Please ensure that these are long enough to be tucked into whichever bottoms your child is wearing. Children's shirts must be tucked in at all times (apart from playtime).

School BLUE/WHITE striped tie (boys and girls)

School BLUE round neck sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece, with Our Lady of Lourdes school logo (girls and boys).

School BLUE cardigan with Our Lady of Lourdes school logo (girls)

School BLUE (not navy) and WHITE check dress may be worn in the summer (girls).

Plain BLACK shoes, not trainers or canvas footwear eg pumps. Children are expected to wear sensible shoes and not boots. In winter, boots can be worn to school however, children will then need to change into their school shoes when in the building. During summer, sandals may be worn. Sandals must have covered toes and straps that secure the ankle. These must be worn with socks (girls and boys).

WHITE or GREY socks (girls and boys). Socks must be knee length or just above the ankle. Sports socks and trainer socks are not permitted.

GREY tights (girls).

School Term Dates: Proposals for 2020/21

Brighton & Hove City Council has a duty to set school term dates for its community schools, community special schools and maintained nursery schools. Governing bodies of voluntary-aided schools (Church of England and Catholic schools) set their own dates and academy trusts set the dates for academies and free schools.

During a normal school year, pupils are required to attend school for 190 days. An additional five days are allowed for in-service training (INSET) for staff.

Brighton & Hove City Council is seeking views on the two proposals outlined overleaf, which show different start and finish dates to the academic year:

- Proposal 1: school year to start on 1 September 2020 and finish on 21 July 2021
- Proposal 2: school year to start on 3 September 2020 and finish on 23 July 2021

Working with neighbouring authorities

Discussions with East Sussex County Council and West Sussex County Council have been ongoing since November 2018, with the aim to align the dates as much as possible. Brighton & Hove's City Council's two proposals match those originally used in the East Sussex and West Sussex consultations.

- West Sussex County Council has now published its chosen model, which is Proposal 2
- East Sussex County Council is consulting on similar proposals, with the differences only being the start and finish dates of the school year – there are no differences to the half-term breaks, Easter break or Christmas break

How we are seeking views from stakeholders

- Partnership Chairs' Meeting on 15 March 2019 (headteachers who chair the school partnerships in the city)
- Secondary and Continuing Education Chairs of Governors' Meeting on 19 March 2019
- Education & Skills Union Consultative Group on 26 April 2019 – representative group of headteachers and school unions
- School staff and governors via the Schools' Bulletin on 29 April 2019 – we encourage schools to forward this to parents through their usual communication channels
- Youth Council – representative group of children and young people
- Diocese of Chichester (Church of England) and Diocese of Arundel and Brighton (Catholic)
- City councillors (via Democratic Services)
