



Dear Parents,

Our Lady of Lourdes has been lucky enough to obtain a number of free saplings to plant inside our Boundary alongside the gardens of Neville Road. All the trees are native varieties local to the area such as: Downy Birch, Rowan, Hazel, Hawthorn, Holly and Crab Apple. As the trees grow, this should provide a lovely backdrop to the school playground, attract a greater amount of wildlife and have huge overall impact on our environment.

We will be holding an official 'Tree Planting Day', as part of National Tree Planting Week, on Friday 29th November. All the children will be involved, and we shall be inviting parents and carers to help with your child's class if you wish! Children should wear their own clothes that day. We are also asking families to make £1.00 donation which will go towards **Just One Tree**, which is a non-profit initiative removing CO2 from the atmosphere through global reforestation. **Just £1 plants 1 Tree**. One Tree donates to established reforestation partners who concentrate their planting in areas severely affected by mass deforestation. In doing so we have the greatest positive effect on combatting global warming whilst simultaneously alleviating extreme poverty within impacted communities through training, education and employment. The non-uniform day will unite children, parents and teachers across the country, demonstrating how an individual's actions can have a positive impact on the environment.

The year groups will be planting the trees at the following times:

BRAND NEW course for couples



Raising a child can have a big impact on a couple's relationship and it can be hard to know what will make things better.

Parents as Partners is a free course for couples who want to improve their relationship for the good of their children. It gives parents going through difficulties the opportunity to work out how to move forward.





How the course works

16 weekly sessions will give you time to work on yourself, your relationship and your approach to parenting your children.

You will be given the chance to talk together about things that might usually be hard to discuss, as well as more fun and lively group discussions with the other parents.

Parents as Partners has proven results in helping parents

- Manage the challenges and stress of family life
- Improve the quality and effectiveness of how they communicate
- Strengthen family relationships and improve children's wellbeing and success
- Reduce conflict and disagreements in the relationship

Parents as Partners has proven results in helping children


Long-term research studies have shown that couples who attend see positive outcomes in their children's lives too:

- A reduction in depression
- A reduction in aggression and hyperactivity
- Improved peer relationships
- Improved school results

The course involves

Small group sessions are always led by expert male and female facilitators. Each week they will use a mix of video clips, creative activities and discussions to give you:

- A place to explore reasons for the difficulties in your relationship
- New, more constructive ways of resolving your differences
- The chance to meet other parents in similar situations



You can attend if you are

- Parents to at least one child under the age of 11 (even if you are not the biological parent)
- Willing and able to attend group sessions together for 16 weeks
- Not currently in care proceedings or private family law proceedings

We welcome parents from all backgrounds, including same sex couples and adoptive parents.


The course will start in Brighton & Hove in January 2020. Ask a professional to refer you, or you can refer yourself. There is a small budget to support with childcare arrangements if needed.



Expecting your first baby together?

The birth of a new baby is a time of huge change for a couple, and the move into parenthood can have a big impact on a couple's relationship.

Family Foundations is a free course for couples expecting their first baby together. It's designed to help you build a strong family unit and fully support your child's development.







How it works

Small group sessions are led by expert male and female facilitators. Each week they will introduce you to different topics to discuss, and communication strategies to try out with your partner.

The course is a great opportunity to meet and connect with other expectant parents.

The course involves

- Relaxed and informal two hour sessions with free tea, coffee and biscuits
- Four sessions before the birth to prepare you for parenthood
- A further three sessions four months later (feel free bring your baby along!)

Family Foundations will help you

- Prepare yourself, and your relationship for the birth of your baby
- Manage stress and handle difficult situations parenthood can bring
- Improve communication with your partner and resolve conflict
- Learn new skills and techniques to strengthen your relationship
- Understand the important role each parent plays in their child's life.

You can attend if you are

- A couple expecting your first child together (even if you have children from previous relationships)
- Between 20 and 32 weeks pregnant at the course start dat (Due date between end of January and mid-April 2020)

We welcome parents from all backgrounds, including same sex couples and those in the adoption process.




