

PARENT COUNCIL MINUTES OF MEETING MONDAY 11TH NOVEMBER 2019

Welcome and minutes of the last meeting

Apologies were received from Nicki Lawes, Marisa Nixon and Sinead Nelson.

Present

Minutes of last meeting

It was agreed that EB would share the school development fund letter to members to review. Outstanding actions – EB to send PING FAQ to office for inclusion in newsletter.

Minutes of the meeting were reviewed and approved

Re-election of roles

Marisa Nixon stood down as a role of parent rep for year 5 due to other commitments, Laura Carpenter and Emma Briggs will remain as co-chairs; this will enable the meetings to be held on alternate Mondays and Fridays. Thank you to Hayley Thistlewaite for agreeing to take on the role secretary and to Candice Hogan and Sophia Fadil for taking up the role of reception parent reps.

Action: EB to share the Terms of Reference which contains more details about the roles.

Swimming

AP fedback that the school has a statutory duty to provide swimming and water safety lessons and each pupil is required to be swim competently over a distance of at least 25 metres. It was noted that the cost to provide swimming has increased since last year. The cost includes the hire of the pool, lifeguards, instructors and transport. To keep the costs to a minimum the school will be using Brighton and Hove buses to return to school after the lesson, rather than a coach (which was used previously) and this reduces the cost from £85 to £55. Parents can pay via installments if required and pupil premium is available.

HT mentioned a swimming school called Wet Wet Wet who provide instructors and the possibility of using the pool in St Dunstan's. This will be taken forward as an option for next year.

Cost of school trips

AP tabled a document which shows the approximate cost by year group of school trips from reception to year 6. The total cost of school trips over 7 years is approximately £854 (£122 per year) per child.

The school will look to work with the parent council and families to ensure a calendar of trips is organized in advance and that families can pay by instalments over time for all trip voluntary contributions. This can then be set out up parent pay. A list of the current costs of school trips is attached.

Action: AP/EB and Ruth Ali (clerk to the governors) to take forward.

The behavior policy was discussed and there was discussion that for some children, time out could have a negative impact on a child who requires play as an important part of their self-regulation. AP reiterated that the use of "time out" is with regards to behavior during playtime and not due to a child's behavior in class. Two main reasons time out will be used is for reflection, to enable children to evaluation their behavior choices in the playground and/or to remove children from the playground to ensure the safety of others.

It was noted that the behavior policy requires a review and a focus on an Inclusion section.

Action: All reps to review behavior policy. Will be discussed again once the new head teacher is in post in the New year.

Parent attendance at events

OA mentioned that for most parents who work part time, Mondays and Fridays are most likely to be the days when they are not a work. It was asked if meet the teacher events and workshops etc. could take place on Mondays or Fridays wherever possible.

Action: AP to take into consideration when organizing future dates however needs to align with staff training requirements.

Any other business

Notice of school trips

It was asked that when parents volunteer to go on a school trip could more notice be given when they have been chosen, as it can be difficult to get the time off from work at short notice.

Action: AP to speak to teachers and office staff.

Food allergies

HT mentioned that it would be helpful to have a list of foods that include ingredients, which may not be obvious, but could affect a child that as an allergy, for example pesto. This would help to ensure that parents are aware when sending children in with a packed lunch.

Action: HT to contact office for a list to share with parents.

School events

AP informed the meeting that Christmas around the world will be taking place in December. The school will also be running forest school lessons in the New Year and will ask for a voluntary contribution of cost £2 per child to cover the cost of the forest school instructor.

It was discussed and agreed that a cake sale will be held on Thursday 14th November, to raise funds for Children in Need.

Date of next meeting: A Friday to be confirmed.
