

Re: End of Term Letter
Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you're well. I'm writing to you today in partnership with Mel Fane, our Chair of Governors at the end of what has been an academic year to remember for lots of reasons.

One of the things that is tangible about our school is the strength of the partnerships between staff, parents, governors, children and the parish. Throughout the year this has been seen countless times, particularly in continuing to deal with the disruption of Covid, which, believe it or not, hasn't disappeared quite as much as the coverage in the media would have us think. In fact, I'm not sure I've had my whole team at my disposal for more than about a quarter of the year. Yet, in spite of this, we've still achieved highly. SATs results were remarkable, but perhaps more importantly, we've seen a return of many of the aspects that make our school so special. Brighton Parade was incredible, sports fixtures and sporting success has been

impressive and plentiful, (Mrs. Golawska has sent you all a report so you can see just how much we've done...but take

a look at our trophy shelf..)

PTFA events have resumed and allowed us all to come back together to enjoy our community and raise money and that money has made such a difference. A huge thank to Kate and her team for all the efforts with the PTFA this year.

I know that those children involved in trips and residentials this year will remember them for such a long time. I've already arranged that the payment for these trips should begin in the autumn for those children in Year 5 and 6 to allow adults to spread the cost in a more sustainable manner. This came from feedback from the Parent Council, which has also resumed and allows us to work together in another way; continuing to look at how we can be the very best we can be. More meetings are scheduled for next year already. Forest School is also back; giving each child in the school an opportunity to get out doors, get active and

develop wider skills, they love it, as you can imagine, and this will continue as we go into the autumn.

You'll remember that November saw our Catholic School Inspection visit which saw us deemed 'outstanding' for our provision across Catholic Life. Inspectors cited how every child was known and loved, with our pastoral care coming in for some serious praise. This is perhaps the biggest testament to our partnership and we couldn't have achieved such comments without your help. Thankyou.

An aspect you may not be so familiar with has been the strengthening of our partnership work across our Deanery of schools. Every catholic school in Brighton and Hove is part of this and we've worked hard to draw these schools further together for the benefit of the whole community. Tying ourselves closer to Newman also brings the benefits for those children continuing their education with them in Year 7 of course and also allows me the chance to see them all when I visit, which I do, regularly – much to their surprise!
