


Year 1 Say a little prayer

They have been amazing at reading the poetry in their pairs, practising the words, and then performing it to each other (and sometimes some very important passing adults).



Year 4 BRIGHT SPARKS


Year 4 have been learning all about electricity! In this lesson the aim was to understand that electricity flows round a circuit. The children were given a battery, wires and a bulb and asked to use their knowledge of circuits to light the bulb.

They worked brilliantly in their pairs and were incredibly chuffed when they succeeded! Well done Year 4!









The Year 4 children also took part in the Emile Multiplication Cup against 18 randomly selected schools in the UK. They ranked 3rd out of the 18 schools which was determined by the number of correct answers relative to how many children took part. At this stage of the year, it is a real triumph! The average amount of correct answers for our class was 68% which is amazing!

Year 5 CROSS WITH CAUTION...

In DT this half term, year 5 looked at the design, build and purposes of bridges. We looked at the use of pillars and beams to span gaps, we explored different truss designs and how these can be used to strengthen bridges and finally, we looked at suspension bridges and how these can be used to span long distances.
