


Year 3 & 4 French






Thanks to the help of some parents, the first stage of our mud kitchen up on the adventure trail is now open and has been enjoyed by years 2 & 4.

Thank you to everyone for their efforts for International Maths Day. The costumes were amazing and the engagement from the children was brilliant. We're looking forward to next year already!




