
#### Year 5 THE BIG 10

We have also been reading our class text 'Wonder', writing poetry and diaries inspired by Auggie's experience. Please enjoy some of Year 5s work!



Two of our parents, Jo and Aoife, are travelling to The Gambia in November with the Gam Med charity. In The Gambia, many patients with injuries rely on traditional medicine and healers. Fractures are often bound with sticks, leading to mal-unions and resulting in permanent deformities. Our parents, along with a team of healthcare professionals, will be providing surgery, physiotherapy and teaching, raising the standards of the hospital treatment in The Gambia.



We held a Mufti at school and have raised £347 which will go towards providing care packs for children and post-operative pain relief.
