Welcome to the Spark Christmas Newsletter. The second half of this term has been busy to say the least. We've had Christmas crafting in Reception,

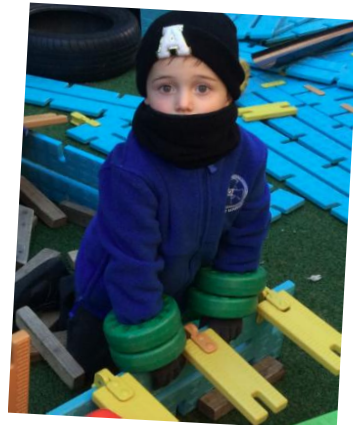

Year 1 SAY A LITTLE PRAYER

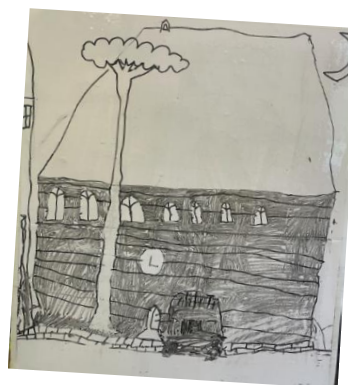

Well done, Year 4!

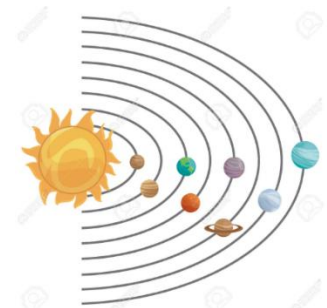

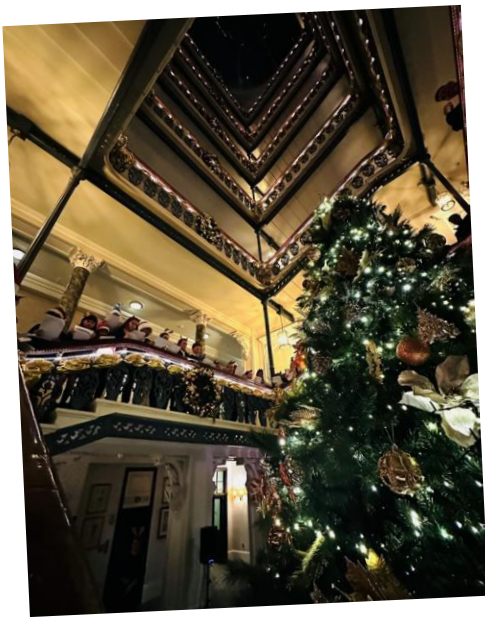

We also look forward to welcoming Demelza in the New Year who will be offering 1:1 drum lessons. Contact the school office for more information.

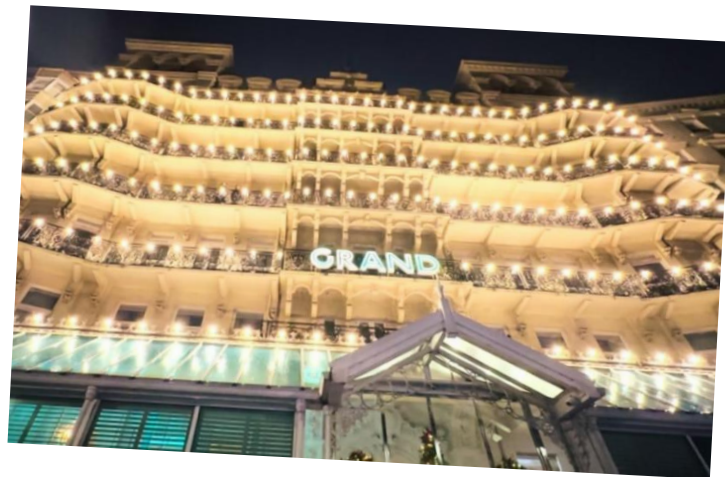
